The Members' Reception Room is in the Lecture Hall, Tower Street. There are Ladies' Reception Rooms on the first floor of the High School for Girls.

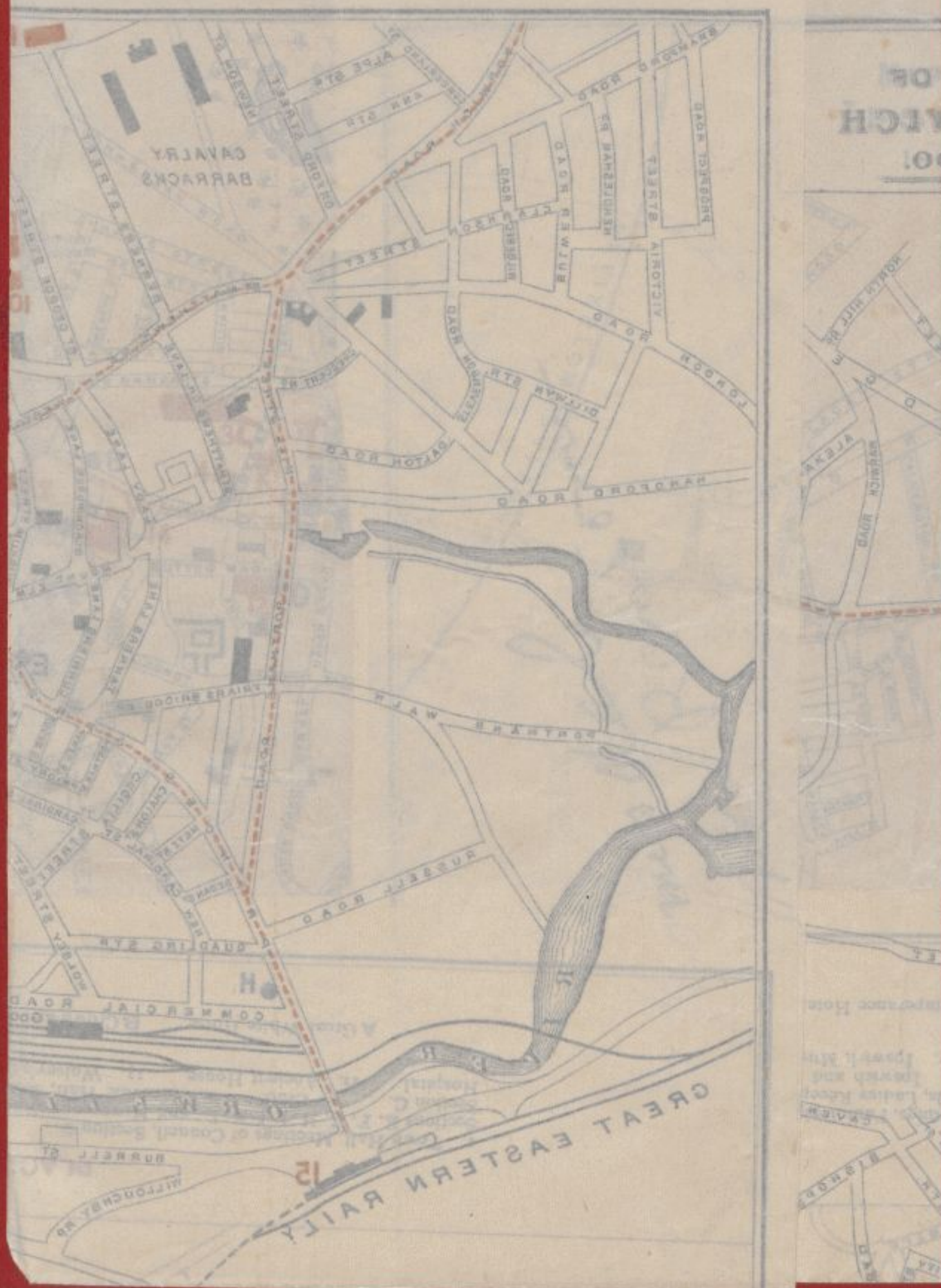
The Post Office and Telegraph Office are in the Reception Room. Members are requested to apply for letters and telegrams from time to time.

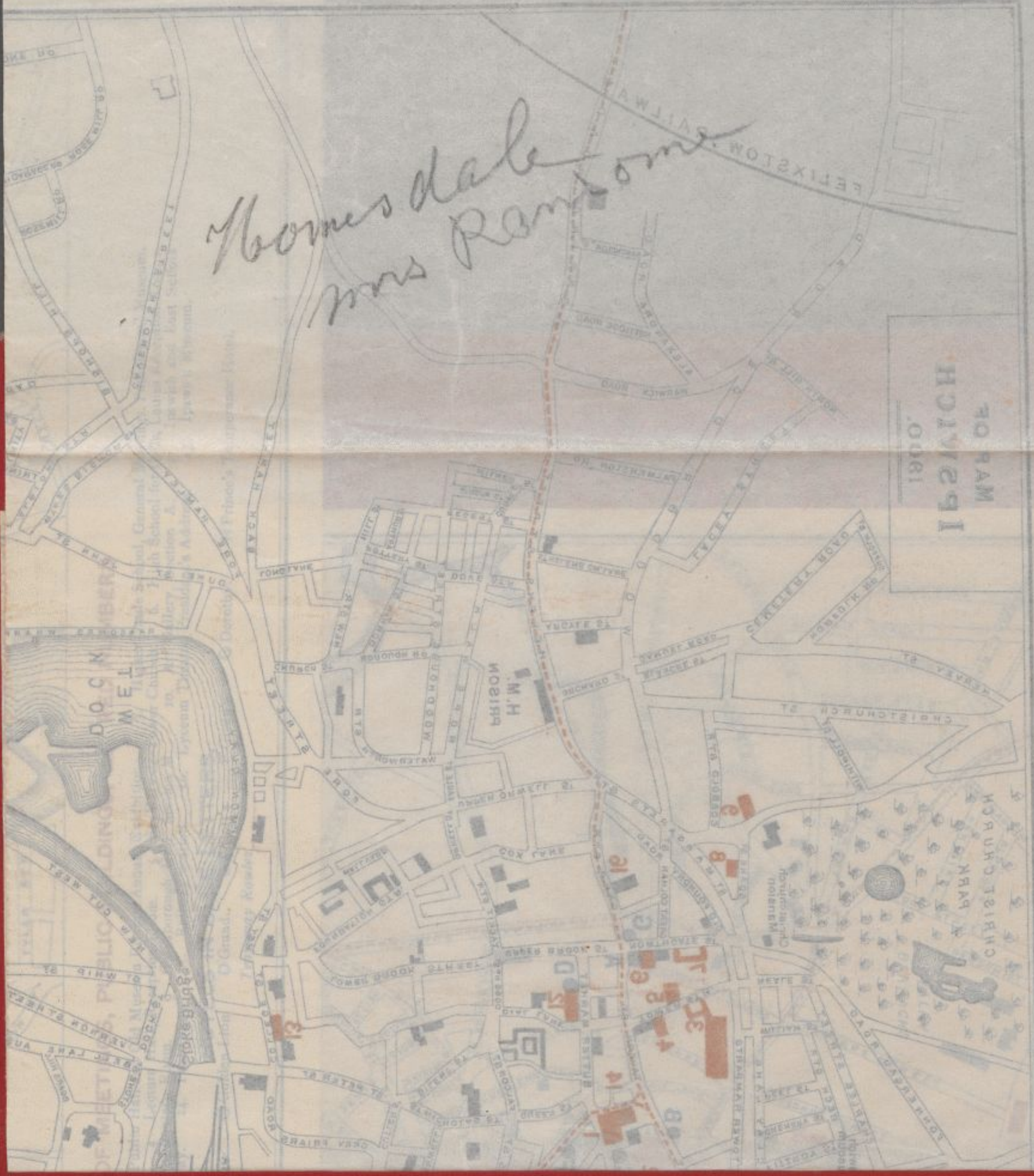

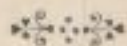
